**ANNOUNCEMENT – PRESS RELEASE**

The Governing Board of the Amador County Office of Education/Amador County Unified School District is announcing that a tentative agreement has been reached with Richard F. (Dick) Glock to succeed Mike Carey as superintendent.

Although Glock will officially report to work on July 1, he expects to spend several days prior visiting the schools and meeting with various individuals and groups within the school district and community.

Mr. Glock was Assistant Superintendent for Educational Support Services in Temecula Valley Unified School District for nine years. Previous to that he was Principal of Temecula Valley High school (3500 students) for two years. During that time he was selected as “Principal of the Year” by the National Association of Secondary School Principals (NASSP).

Mr. Glock also worked in the Hemet Unified School District, where he was a K-8 principal as well as an assistant principal and principal (eight years) at Hemet High School. During his career he has been an assistant superintendent and superintendent of schools in Nebraska. He has also been a teacher, coach, activities director and athletic director.

Glock attended the University of Nebraska-Lincoln as an undergraduate, masters and post-masters student. The emphases of his graduate work were curriculum, instruction, administration and school effectiveness.

Although a 20-year resident of southern California, Mr. Glock has known of Amador County for several years through friends in the area. Glock notes that a close-knit, supportive community that reflects family values and has education as a high priority are all things that attracted him and his family to Amador County. His wife, Brenda, is an English teacher at San Jacinto High School. They have one son who is a high school sophomore and another son in the seventh grade. The family hopes to move here in late summer. Additionally, the Glocks have five adult children who reside in Nebraska and southern California.

Mr. Glock is enthusiastically looking forward to serving the students, staff, parents, patrons and Governing Board as well as becoming part of the Amador community. He will be introduced by the Board at its April 23 regular meeting, 7 pm at the County Administration Building.
