Who?

- Students in grades 5, 7, 9, 11
- Positive Permission Required for Grade 5
- All Students in Grades 7, 9, 11 take it unless Parent opts out

ACUSD/ACOE Strengths:

High School Strengths

- 90% of students feel safe from harassment for their race, ethnicity, religion, gender, sexual orientation or their physical or mental disability.

High School Strengths

Low Substance Use at School

- 71st percentile compared to state

High School Strengths

Low Physical Violence Perpetration

- 74th percentile compared to state

High School Strengths

- 81% of high school students feel treated with respect and feel that teachers and grown-ups at school care about them.

Middle School Strengths

- 81% of our middle school students report they try hard on their school work.

Middle School Strengths

- 87% of students feel safe from harassment for their race, ethnicity, religion, gender, sexual orientation or their physical or mental disability.

Middle School Strengths

Low Substance Use at School

- 76th percentile compared to state
- 77th percentile compared to similar schools

Middle School Strengths

Low Physical Violence Perpetration

- 70th percentile compared to state
- 71st percentile compared to similar schools

Elementary School Strengths

- 81% of our elementary students feel they are treated with respect.
- 86% of elementary students feel that the school teaches them to care about each other and to treat others with respect.

Elementary School Strengths

- 81% of students feel safe at school.
- 80% of students feel their teachers teach them to be responsible for their actions.
- 90% of students know the school rules and follow them.

Elementary School Strengths

- 86% of elementary students have strong academic motivation.
- 93% feel that teachers and other grown-ups at their school want them to do their best.

ACUSD/ACOE Opportunities for Improvement:

Middle School Opportunities

- Our middle school students are in the 36th percentile when compared to the rest of the state.
- Our middle school students are in the 24th percentile when compared to similar schools.
- This is an improvement from the 28th and 18th percentile from last year.

Middle School Opportunities

High Expectations and Caring Relationships

- 10th percentile compared to state
- 7th percentile compared to similar schools

Again growth from last year, up from the 5th and 5th percentiles.

Middle School Opportunities

- School Connectedness
 - 16th percentile compared to state
 - 4th percentile compared to similar schools

Middle School Opportunities

- Perceived School Safety
 - 22nd percentile compared to state
 - 6th percentile compared to similar schools

Middle School Opportunities

- Opportunities for Meaningful Participation
 - 21st percentile compared to state
 - 8th percentile compared to similar schools

High School Opportunities

- High Levels of Meaningful Participation
 - 11% of 9th grade students
 - 9% of 10th grade student
 - 16% of 11th grade students
 - 11% of 12th grade students

High School Opportunities

- Experienced Chronic Sadness/Hopelessness
 - 39% of 9th grade students
 - 39% of 10th grade students
 - 36% of 11th grade students
 - 40% of 12th grade students

Elementary School Opportunities

- 16% of our students said they have high levels of meaningful participation.
- 49% said they have high levels of caring adult relationships.

Where do we go from here?

- The work has already begun!
 - School-level data reports
 - MTSS
 - Data cycles
 - Parent engagement activities
 - Mini-surveys to check in
 - Social-emotional curriculum pilot
 - WEB, LINK crew, safe & civil schools
 - Collaboration with other agencies
 - Re-assess in March 2019
