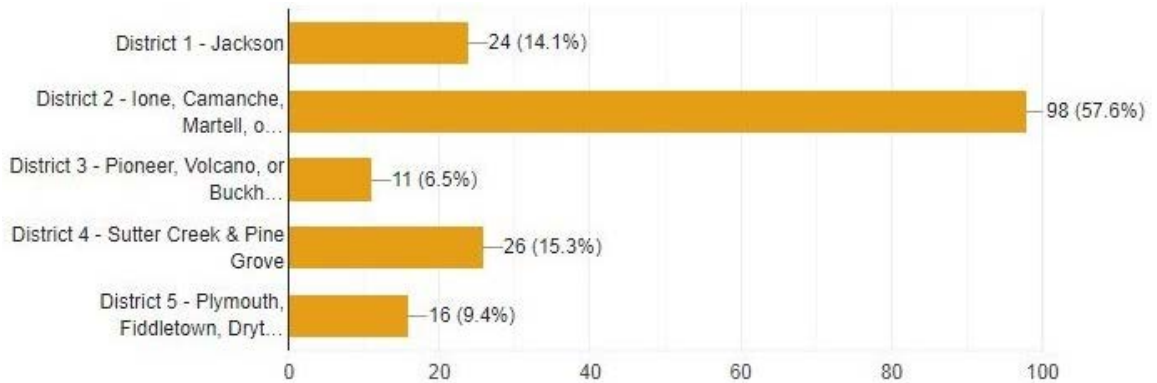


Lone Community Survey Results

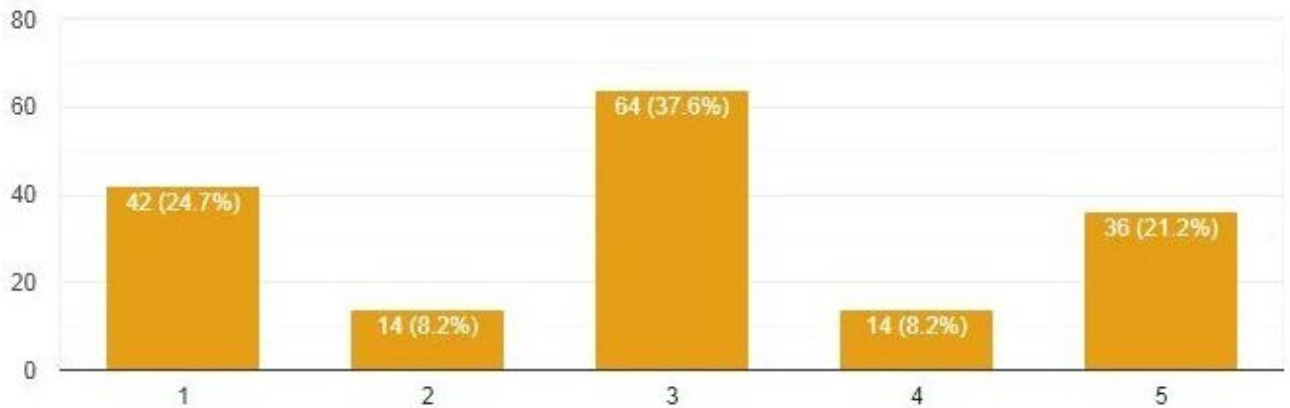

Scale: 1 – No/not supportive 5 – Yes/highly supportive

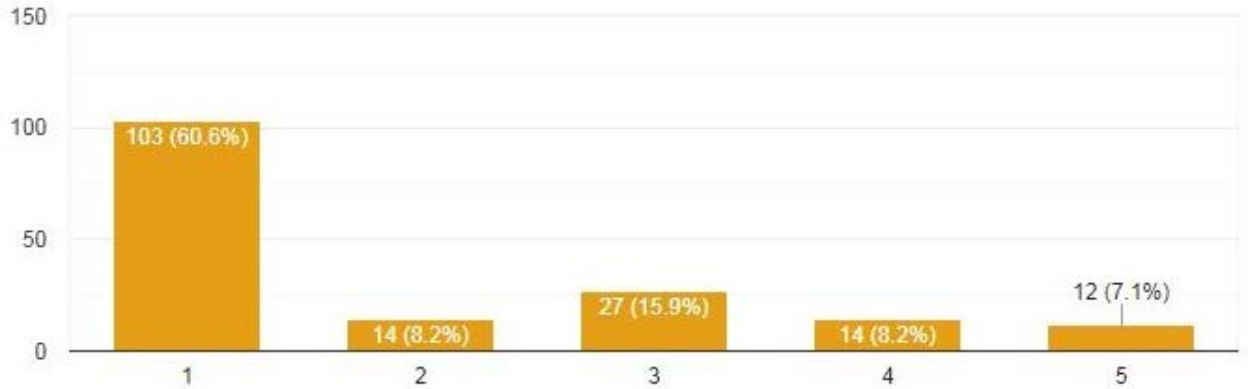
1. Which supervisorial district do you live in?



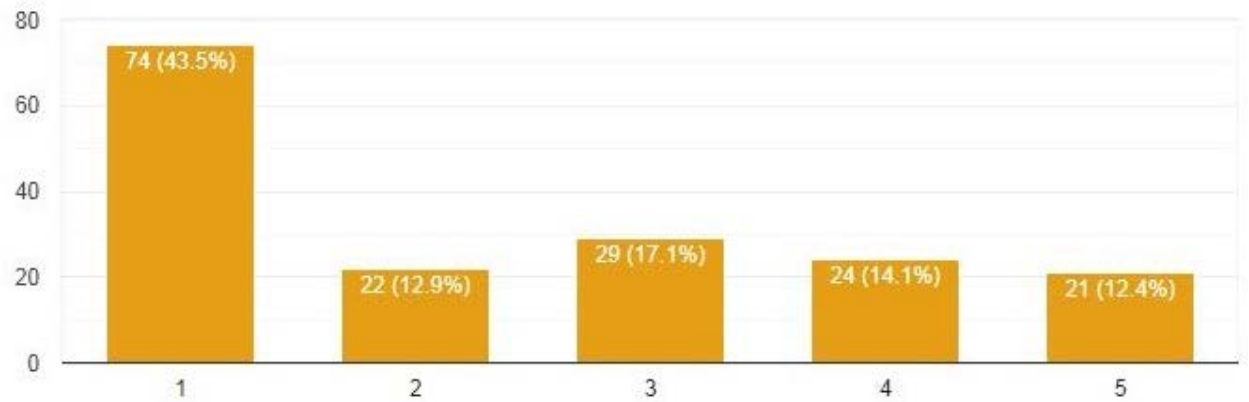
2. How supportive are you of moving the Lone Elementary School State Preschool class to another location?



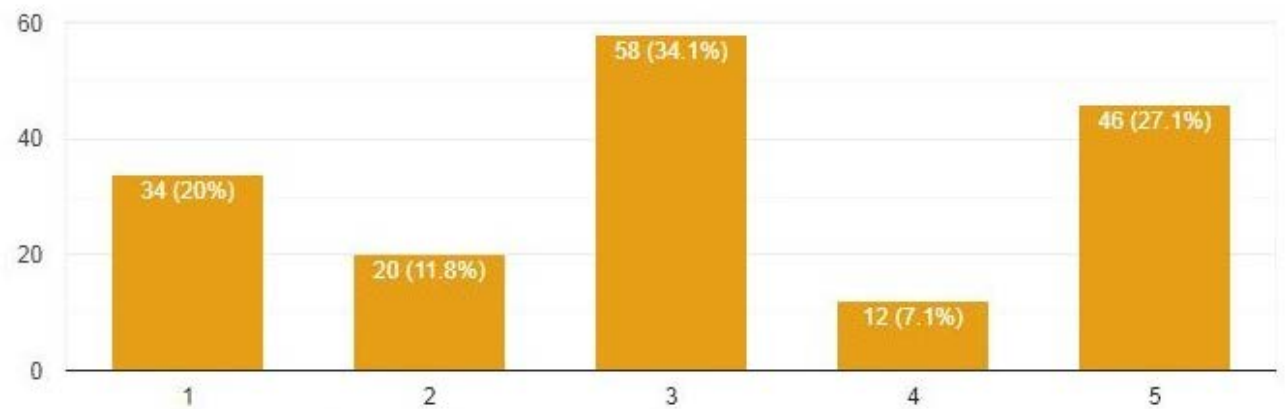
3. How supportive are you of moving the lone Elementary School 5th grad students to lone Junior High School as a school-within-a-school concept with 6th grade students?



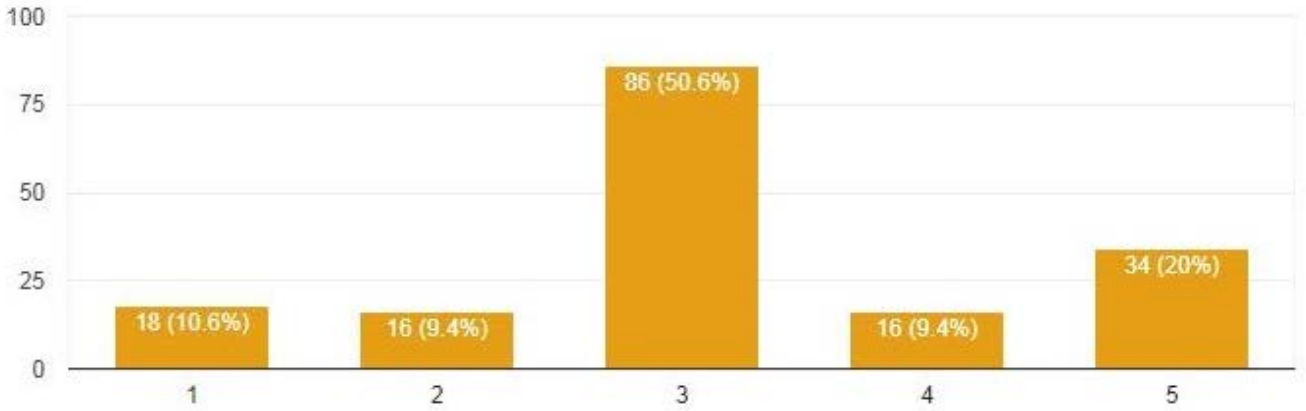

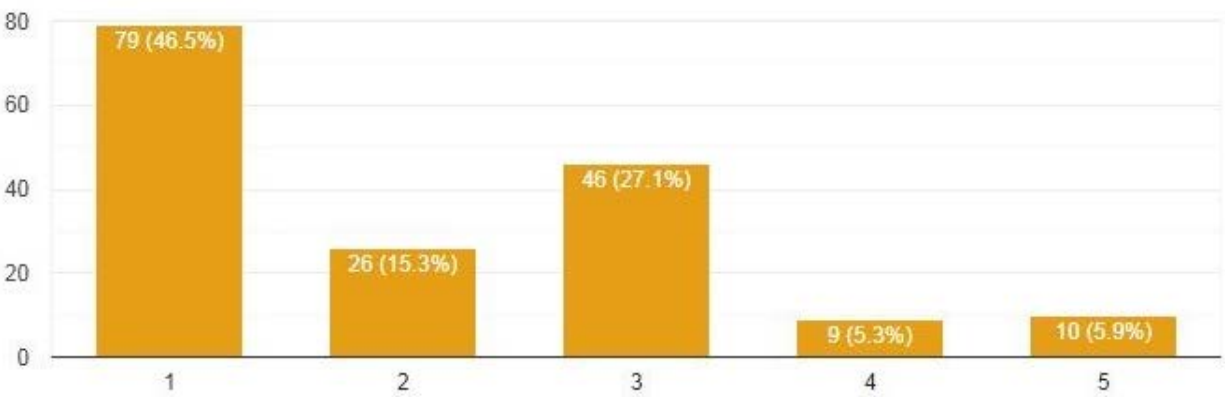
5. How supportive are you of moving the two Intensive Intervention (II) classes currently at lone Elementary School to another location?



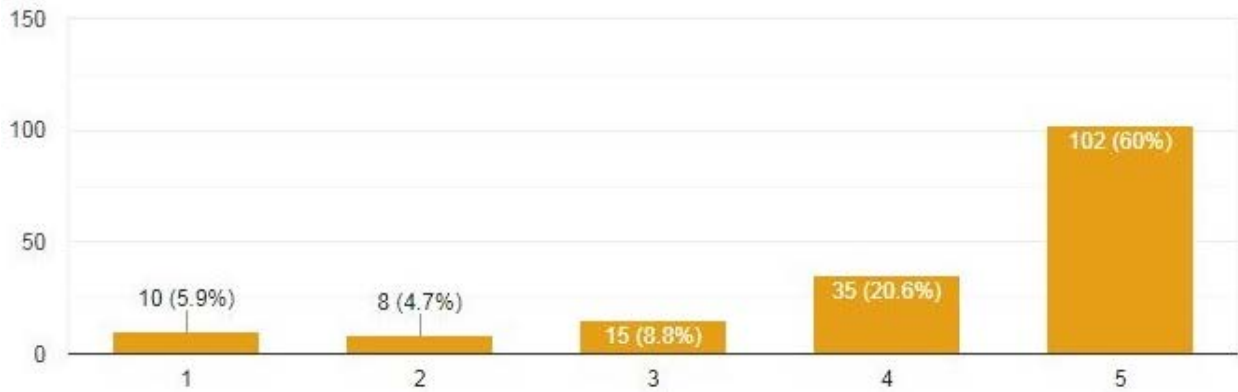
6. How supportive are you of moving the Lone Elementary School Extended Learning Program (ELP) to another location at Lone Elementary School?



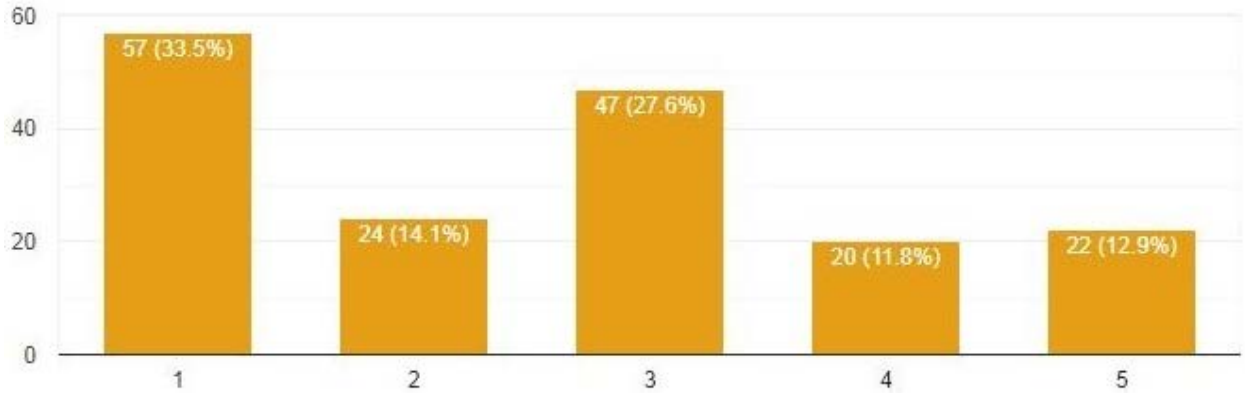
7. How supportive are you of moving the Lone Elementary School Extended Learning Program (ELP) to another location NOT at Lone Elementary School?



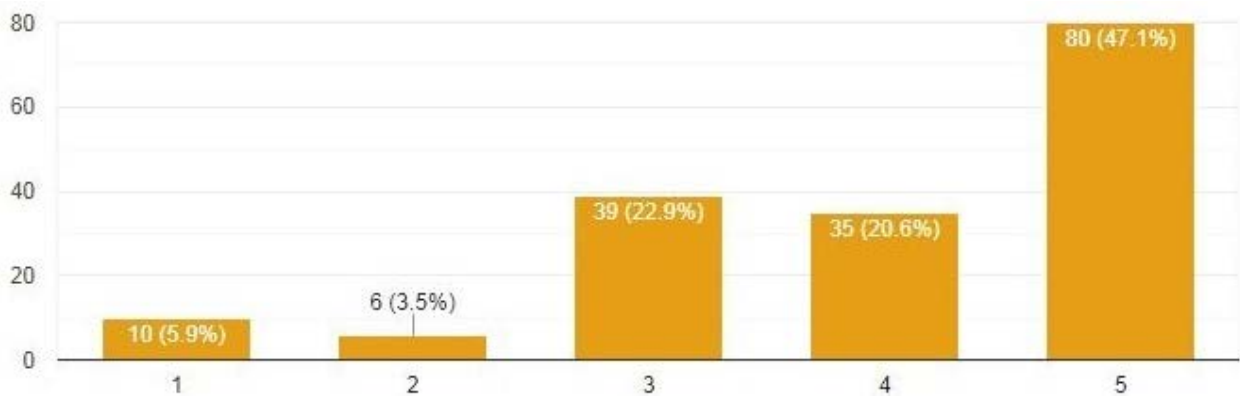
8. How supportive are you of the addition of three new classroom buildings (not portable buildings) at Lone Elementary School in 2020, through the use of Developer Fees?



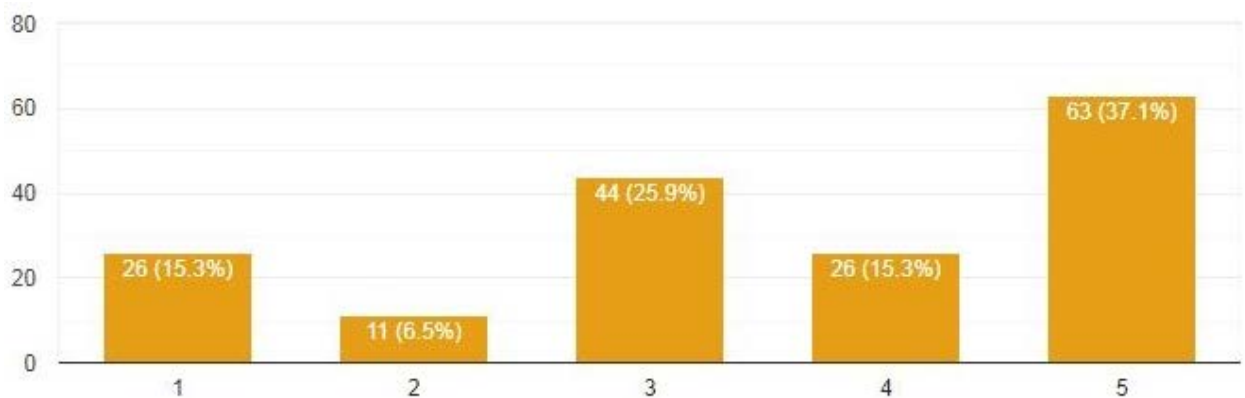

Additional Ideas and Suggestions

We had several additional ideas and suggestions to address the issue of enrollment growth and facility needs in the lone community. The bullet points below summarize the reoccurring themes from all suggestions.

- Negotiate better with developers to increase developer fees and have more developer funds go toward the lone schools.
- Work with the new casino, the City of lone, and the State to receive more funding for refurbishing current structures or building new structures.
- Look into combining other school sites or building new combined school sites.
- Remove the portables at lone Elementary and build more permanent structures. Continue to remove portables at other sites once completed at lone Elementary.
- Keep the younger grades separate from the Jr. High School grades for the time being.
- Continue to rebuild trust with the community and plan better for a future Bond Measure effort.
