Our Current Preparation

- Every school has a Board approved Comprehensive School Safety Plan.
- Every school practices the plan.
- Every classroom has/will have emergency buckets filled with supplies.
- Training and support is ongoing.
- Collaboration with law enforcement and community agencies is key.

The Current Context: Collaboration

- Emergency buckets with lock-down kits provided by Amador County Sheriff's Office of Emergency Services
- Communication with Under Sheriff Jim Wegner and Sheriff Martin Ryan
- Collaboration with Sutter Creek, Ione, and Jackson Police Departments
- Attendance at active shooter training sponsored by Amador County Disaster Preparedness Coalition
- Communication with Sergeant Parks who will assist with "Run, Hide, Fight" training and table top exercise for managers
- Collaboration with Amador County Mental Health Advisory Board

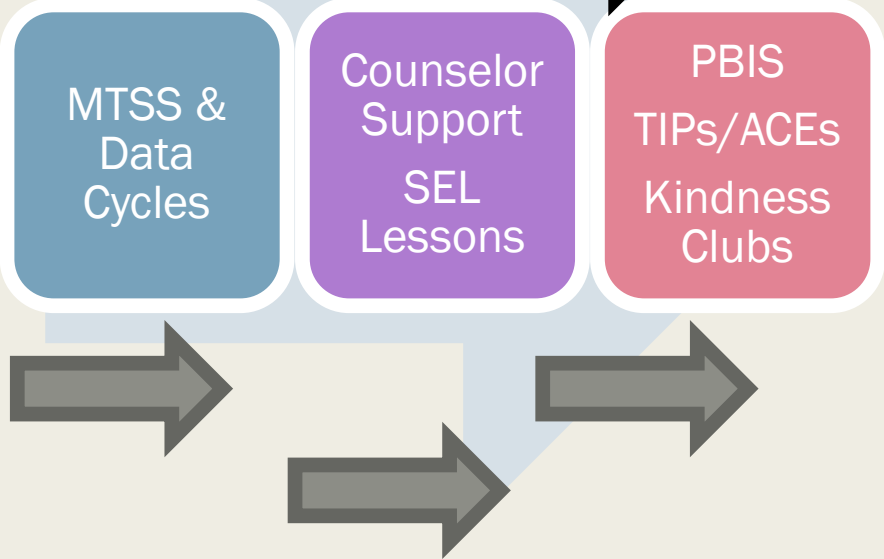

Elementary Level

Secondary Level

- Semester fire drills
- Semester lockdown drills
- Semester earthquake drills

Safety Plans

- Annual updates approved by the Board of Trustees by March 1st
- Some of the required components
 - *Evacuation map*
 - *Roles & responsibilities*
 - *Procedures for specific types of school emergencies*
 - *Relocation and evacuation locations*
 - *Emergency contact information*
 - *Staff/students medical needs information*
